Inspired by vernacular objects which he dresses in dream and in history, the artist reinterprets and deconstructs jars, amphoras and packagings of clay, giving a sculptural scale to these former forms and questioning the archaeological remains, the tracks of the sedimented time - as the witnesses of an eternal memory.

We know well the work of Antoine and the obvious fact of a new collaboration was immediately imperative. The gallery is delighted to open its germanopratines doors in this exceptional exhibition.

Antoine PIERINI

Antoine Pierini was born in Biot in 1980 into a family of artists. His father Robert Pierini, one of France's most famous glass artists, helped elevate the status of glass art in the 1980s.

In 2003, Pierini did an internship at the Musée-atelier du verre in Sars-Poteries (Nord-Pas de Calais) with David Reekie, a master of glass-casting (casting molten glass into a mold) and Udo Zembock, a glass fusing specialist (assembling of thermoformed glass plates). Next he went to the Pilchuck Glass School in the state of Washington to work with Davide Salavadore. In 2014, he again traveled to the United States to do an artist's residency at the Tacoma Museum of Glass in Tacoma, Washington.

Pierini seeks to detach himself from the object and its functional aspect to deal with a more sculptural world in a sleek, contemporary style. He is interested in the relationship between shapes, lines and colors. His approach as an artist is inspired by the observation of nature and its changing landscapes. Today, Pierini regularly shows his work in the top galleries in Europe, the United States and Canada. It is already a part of various museum collections.
